**Section 1 - ICASSTT<sup>®</sup>, LLC Trail Qualifying Event Rules; Each State will have their own State's Trail (Senior Division)**

### **7th Grade through 12th Grade Participation Guidelines**

This ensures that all anglers interested in earning points for the **ABT Series** can fully participate and compete.

- **For States with High School Bass Fishing Sanctioning:**

All members of a team must attend the **same high school** to compete in **ICASSTT<sup>®</sup>, LLC** events.

*(This applies to Illinois teams.)*

- **If Your School Doesn't Have a Team:**  
Contact [icassttdirector@gmail.com](mailto:icassttdirector@gmail.com) to request an **ICASSTT®, LLC denial letter** for participation. *(This applies to Illinois teams.)*
- **7th and 8th Graders:**  
Middle school anglers must attend a school within the **same district** as the high school team they represent.

#### **For States Without High School Bass Fishing Sanctioning:**

- **Regional Club Teams:**
  - Regional club teams are eligible to compete in **ICASSTT®, LLC** events. *(Applies to Missouri and Wisconsin teams.)*
- **High School Teams Preferred:**
  - **ICASSTT®, LLC** prioritizes high school-based teams for competition.

#### **ICASSTT®, LLC Competition Guidelines**

- **Team Composition & Points Accumulation:**
  - A team is defined as two anglers who will accumulate Clash Championship Points for their home state.
  - These two anglers **must fish together** in their state's ICASSTT®, LLC Clash Championship.
  - Each team is allowed **one substitute** per fall and spring season.
    - Teams must notify **Humberto Gonzalez** in advance when using a substitute.
    - Exceptions may be made but must be communicated well in advance.
- **Angler Replacement Rules:**
  - With ICASSTT®, LLC approval, a coach may replace an angler under certain conditions, such as:
    - The previous angler was removed from the team.
    - The previous angler has disciplinary issues (requires a letter from the school).
    - The previous angler is ill.
    - Other reasons will be considered but not all will be accepted.
- **Solo Angler Rules:**
  - If a team splits into solo anglers, both anglers retain their points; no restart is needed.
  - If a solo angler gains a partner mid-season:
    - Points will not restart.
    - The new partner must not have participated in any tournament prior.
    - If the new partner has fished with another team, different rules apply (see Rule 3c).
  - If a team switches partners permanently, points will reset, and they must start accumulating Clash Championship Points again.
- **Scholarship Awards Breakdown:**
  - **Physical checks** will be given at the awards ceremony.
  - Prizes awarded to:
    - 1st Place
    - 2nd Place
    - 3rd Place
    - 4th Place
    - 5th Place

- 6th–10th Place (if more than 200 boats register).
  - **Big Bass Award** will also be given.
- **Tournament Duration & Rules:**
  - Tournaments must last a **minimum of 7 hours** unless otherwise noted.
  - A completed tournament must last **at least 4 hours**.
  - Any tournament under 4 hours will not count as completed:
    - No awards, scholarships, or Clash qualifying points will be given.
    - ICASSTT®, LLC will attempt to reschedule incomplete tournaments.
    - Teams can request a refund if a rescheduled date conflicts with their schedule (must notify within 24 hours).
    - If a tournament cannot be rescheduled, all participating teams will receive refunds (Square fees may or may not be refunded).
- **Coaches/Boaters on the Boat:**
  - **Coaches/Boaters cannot fish** during the tournament.
  - They are allowed to:
    - Verbally coach and physically assist anglers.
    - Tie knots, handle rods, manage tackle, and cull fish.
    - Care for fish in the livewell and assist with the trolling motor.
    - Net fish and hold an angler's rod while the angler nets fish.
    - Remove hooks from fish.
  - **Coaches are encouraged** to actively guide anglers but must refrain from fishing themselves.

## Illinois: ICASSTT Only Guidelines

- **Divisions Overview:**
  - There are **3 Divisions** to qualify for the Clash Championship.
  - All teams are automatically entered into these Divisions based on the geographic location of the body of water where events are held.
  - **ICASSTT Northern Division**
    - Your **best 5 events** will determine your Divisional Score.
  - **ICASSTT Central Division**
    - Your **best 5 events** will determine your Divisional Score.
  - **ICASSTT Southern Division**
    - Your **best 5 events** will determine your Divisional Score.
- **ICASSTT Opens:**
  - Opens will award **full points** only if there are **at least 20 boats** in the field.
  - Opens will **not** provide automatic Clash Bids.
- **Wild Card Qualifiers:**
  - An additional **10 boats** will qualify for the Clash Championship via Wild Card.
  - Wild Card qualification is based on a boat's **best 10 events**.

## Missouri: MCASSTT Only

- **No Divisions:**
  - There will be no divisions in MCASSTT for this season.
- **Point Accumulation:**
  - Teams will accumulate points at **every event** throughout the season.
- **First-Year Evaluation:**
  - This is the first year of MCASSTT. Data from this season will help determine the best system for future seasons.

## Wisconsin: WCASSTT Only

- **No Divisions:**
  - There will be no divisions in WCASSTT for this season.
- **Point Accumulation:**
  - Teams will accumulate points at **every event** throughout the season.
- **First-Year Evaluation:**
  - This is the first year of WCASSTT. Data from this season will help determine the best system for future seasons.

## State's Clash Championship: How to Qualify

Illinois: ICASSTT Only – 70 Boats for Lake Springfield Clash Championship

- **Ways to Qualify for the Top 70 Boats:**

- **Automatic Qualification:**

- The winning boat at any event earns an automatic bid to The Clash Championship.

- **Divisional Bids:**

- 20 boats from each division (Northern, Central, Southern) qualify via points or Champion Event Auto Bid.

- **Wild Card Bids:**

- 10 boats qualify based on their best 10 events in the Wild Card Division.

- **Points Tracking:**

- ICASSTT®, LLC will track all points.
- Standings will be updated on [www.icasstt.org](http://www.icasstt.org) by Monday evening after each event.

- **Bid Allocation Rules:**

- If a team earns multiple bids in different divisions, the bid will be awarded as follows:
  - Taken from the division with the **highest point value** (Northern, Central, Southern).
  - If tied between two divisions, the bid will go to the **highest standings** in the tie.
- In the event of a tie between two different teams:
  - **Tie-breaker:** Total Series Points.
  - If the tie cannot be broken, more than 70 boats may qualify for The Clash.

- **Division Participation Flexibility:**

- Illinois teams are not required to commit to any single division.
- Teams can choose where they want to fish and treat the series as an isolated divisional series.

### Missouri: MCASSTT – 100 Boats for Lake Pomme de Terre Clash Championship

- **Ways to Qualify for the Top 100 Boats:**

- **Automatic Qualification:**

- The winning boat at any event earns an automatic bid to The Clash Championship.

- **Point-Based Qualification:**

- Remaining boats will qualify based on points until the top 100 boats are selected.

- **Points Tracking:**

- ICASSTT®, LLC will track all points.
- Standings will be updated on [www.icasstt.org](http://www.icasstt.org) by Monday evening after each event.
- All points will be finalized by Monday evenings.

- **Tie-Breaker Rule:**

- If there is a tie, more than 100 boats may qualify for The Clash.

### Wisconsin: WCASSTT – ~40 Boats for Lake TBD Clash Championship

- **Ways to Qualify for the Top ~40 Boats:**

- **Automatic Qualification:**
  - The winning boat at any event earns an automatic bid to The Clash Championship.
- **Point-Based Qualification:**
  - Remaining boats will qualify based on points until the top ~40 boats are selected.
- **Points Tracking:**
  - ICASSTT®, LLC will track all points.
  - Standings will be updated on [www.icasstt.org](http://www.icasstt.org) by Monday evening after each event.
  - All points will be finalized by Monday evenings.
- **Tie-Breaker Rule:**
  - If there is a tie, more than ~40 boats may qualify for The Clash.

## [Section 2 - ICASSTT®, LLC Clash Championship; Each State will have their own Championship \(High School Only\)](#)

### Clash Championship Overview

- **Tournament Format:**
  - **Illinois:** 2-day tournament.
  - **Missouri & Wisconsin:** 1-day tournament.
- **Entry Fee:**
  - There will be an entry fee to cover tournament expenses.
- **Awards and Prizes:**
  - **Plaques** for the top 5 teams.
  - **Scholarships** for the top 10 teams.
  - **Clash Championship Plaque** for the winning school/club.
  - **Big Bass Award** for the largest catch.
  - **Goodie Bag** for each boat, valued between \$60-\$100.
    - 1. The bag includes a commemorative Clash Championship T-shirt and a variety of tackle.
- **Takeoff Order:**
  - **Day 1 Takeoff:** Random draw in 3 tiers:
    1. All-State Standings
    2. Event Champions
    3. Remaining boats
  - **Day 2 Takeoff:** Reverse order of Day 1.
- **Scholarships Breakdown:**
  - **1st place team**

- **2nd place team**
- **3rd place team**
- **4th place team**
- **5th place team**
- **6th place team**
- **7th place team**
- **8th place team**
- **9th place team**
- **10th place team**
- **Big Bass**

### [Section 3 - ICASSTT®, LLC Team of the Year Award T.O.Y. \(High School Only\)](#)

#### **Clash Championship Scoring and T.O.Y. (Team of the Year) Guidelines**

- **Scoring for Schools/Clubs:**
  - Each school/club can score their **highest placing up to 2 boats** in each ICASSTT®, LLC tournament for the Clash Championship.
- **Team of the Year (T.O.Y.):**
  - Each state will have its own **Team of the Year (T.O.Y.)**.
  - A team must **weigh at least 1 bass** to earn points toward the T.O.Y. standings.
- **T.O.Y. Award:**
  - The **T.O.Y.** will receive:
    - A **plaque** for recognition.
    - **\$500** for the school/club.
- **Tie Breaker:**
  - In case of a tie for T.O.Y., the tie-breaker will be determined by the **Clash Championship finish**.

#### **Illinois: ICASSTT Only**

- **Best 10 Events:**
  - Only the **best 10 events** will count toward T.O.Y. points for each school.
- **ICASSTT Opens:**
  - Opens will be worth  $\frac{1}{2}$  **points** from the scoring table if the field has **fewer than 20 boats**.

#### **Missouri: MCASSTT Only**

- **All Events Count:**
  - **All events** will count toward T.O.Y. points for each school/club.

## Wisconsin: WCASSTT Only

- **All Events Count:**
  - **All events** will count toward T.O.Y. points for each school/club.

  - The top team in All-State will be crowned **Angler of the Year (A.O.Y.)**.
  - In the event of a tie, additional **All-State winners** will be named.
  - **Missouri and Wisconsin** All-State numbers may vary based on participation.
- **Additional Awards:**
  - **Coach of the Year**

### **All-State Angler Scoring:**

- **Qualification to Score All-State Points:**

- Points can be earned at all ICASSTT®, LLC events.
- **Top 30%** in any event automatically earns points.
- **Illinois:** Only the **best 10 events** count for All-State points.
- **Illinois:** Must score a minimum of **2 events per division**.
- **Missouri and Wisconsin:** All events will count toward All-State points.
- **Illinois Mini's:** Worth  $\frac{1}{2}$  **points** from the scoring table.
- **Illinois Open's:** Worth  $\frac{1}{2}$  **points** from the scoring table, Worth **full points** from the scoring table if the Open has more than 20 boats.

### **Point System for All-State Angler Scoring:**

- **1st place finish:** 10 All-State Points
- **Top 10% finish:** 8 All-State Points
- **Top 20% finish:** 6 All-State Points
- **Top 30% finish:** 4 All-State Points
- **Live Standings:**
  - Standings will be available on [www.icasstt.org](http://www.icasstt.org) for tracking throughout the season.

### **All-Stars Point System:**

- Points are based on **best 5 events** per division.
  - **Illinois:** Best 5 events per region/division.
  - **Missouri & Wisconsin:** All events count toward All-Star points.
- **Illinois** will have an **All-Star event** per region/division.
- **Missouri & Wisconsin:** All-Stars will be based on available permits.

### **Awards and Honors:**

- **ICASSTT®, LLC Angler of the Year (A.O.Y.):**
  - Awarded to the top All-State angler (duo or single).
- **ICASSTT®, LLC Coach(es) of the Year:**
  - Awarded to the **Team of the Year**.

## Section 5 - The CASSTT Midwest Clash Championship - 100 Boats TBD Lake

*The CASSTT Midwest Clash Championship will be a 3-day event to crown the CASSTT Champion. As this is the inaugural year for the Midwest Clash Championship, some details are still being finalized. Below is what we hope to offer for our qualifiers. Moving forward, the Midwest Clash aims to grow each year by adding new Midwest states to start their own series. Day 1 of the Event will be a seminar awards banquet, day 2 & 3 will be the tournament.*

*Bids will also be extended to other Midwest states for invitations until CASSTT establishes a series in their state. All bids are subject to change based on participation throughout the year.*

- **Illinois: ICASSTT**
  - ~Top **30 boats** will earn a bid.
- **Missouri: MCASSTT**
  - ~Top **50 boats** will earn a bid.
- **Wisconsin: WCASSTT**
  - ~Top **20 boats** will earn a bid.
- **Other Midwest States**
  - For the first year, other Midwest states will receive an invitation from **Humberto Gonzalez**.
- **Qualification Requirement:**
  - To qualify for the **Midwest Clash Championship**, you must compete in your **State's Clash Championship**. (Illinois, Missouri, Wisconsin)

## Section 6 - ICASSTT<sup>®</sup>, LLC Fishing Rules

1. **Event Hours:**
  - a. Most events: **7:00 am - 2:00 pm** (7 hours) unless noted otherwise.
  - b. Some events may start at **sunrise** or **6 am** due to weather.
  - c. **Juniors** compete immediately after High School and **1 hour prior** to High School times.
2. **Safety Regulations:**
  - a. All participants must wear life jackets when the **outboard motor** is running.
  - b. **Juniors** must wear life jackets **at all times**.
  - c. Students should wear **eye protection** and **hat protection**.
  - d. Boats must observe the **lake's horsepower** and **speed limits** (monitored by the lake authorities).
  - e. Boat captains must be of **legal age** and represent their school/club.
  - f. Every angler must follow state and lake laws, including having a **current fishing license** (if applicable).

### 3. Boat Rules:

- a. Only the **boat captain** can operate the outboard motor, except for **launching and loading**.
- b. Teams may bring in up to **5 bass** for weigh-in (subject to state youth regulations).
- c. Each bass must be at least **12" in length** (subject to state regulations).
- d. Weighing in a fish shorter than 12" will result in losing that fish and the biggest fish.
- e. **Courtesy Bumps** are allowed only if requested.
- f. In extreme heat or special circumstances, a **3-fish limit** may be adopted.

### 4. Fish Handling & Conservation:

- a. All fish must be kept in an **aerated livewell**.
- b. **Floggers** are allowed, but **no penetrating cull tags**.
- c. A penalty of **1lb per tag** will be assessed if penetrating cull tags are used.
- d. **Dead fish penalties:**
  - i. **1 dead fish:** 8 oz ( $\frac{1}{2}$  lb) penalty.
  - ii. **2 dead fish:** 12 oz ( $\frac{3}{4}$  lb) penalty.
  - iii. **3 dead fish:** 1 lb penalty.
- e. You may only cull **live fish**, not dead ones.
- f. Teams may weigh in **1 struggling fish** early (e.g., gut-hooked, struggling in livewell).
- g. **Contact the Tournament Director** if you weigh a struggling fish early.
- h. A **1-pound penalty per minute** will apply for being late to weigh-in.
- i. Teams are **DQ'd after 5 minutes** of tardiness.

### 5. Fishing Regulations:

- a. Official weigh-ins begin **2 hours** before the event ends.
- b. Only **smallmouth** and **largemouth bass** are allowed (no striped bass).
- c. **Artificial baits only:** No live bait or trolling.
- d. Only **one pole per angler** is allowed at a time.
- e. No **A-Rigs** allowed.
- f. Fish must be caught **by legal means** (rod, reel, hook, and line).
- g. Snagged or **foul-hooked fish** on spawning beds must be **immediately released**.

### 6. Weigh-In Procedures:

- a. Fish will be transported in **weigh bags** to the scale.
- b. After weigh-ins, anglers must report to the **back of the RV** for a photo.
- c. Fish will be **released back into the lake** after weighing and photographing unless a release boat is available.

### 7. Tie-Breaker Procedure:

- a. If there is a tie, the **heaviest fish** is the first tiebreaker.
- b. The **number of fish** is the second tiebreaker.
- c. The third tiebreaker is a **coin flip**.
- d. At the **Clash Championship**, the **Big Bass** of either day will break any ties.

### 8. Team Compliance:

- a. All members, including the **boat captain**, must follow **lake-specific rules**.
  - b. **Violation of lake rules** may lead to **disqualification** and potential **banishment** from the series.
  - c. Teams wishing to file a complaint must do so **in writing to the tournament director** within **10 minutes** after the event ends.
  - d. **Random coaches** will be selected to monitor rules during events.
  - e. If a coach violates the rules, the **team will be disqualified**, and the coach may be banned from future events.
  - f. A school/club may be placed on **probation** or banned for rule violations.
9. **Penalties for Violations:**
- a. Any rule violation may result in **disqualification**.
  - b. The violating coach may be banned from future events, and the **school/club** could be placed on probation or banned.
  - c. **Clash Championship violations** will result in **loss of qualification** for the following year.

## Section 7 - ICASSTT<sup>®</sup>, LLC Schedule on day of Events

- a. **Event Schedule:** (Subject to change via email notice)
  - i. **Check-ins:** Approximately **2 hours** before event start and stage in take-off order (see pre-meeting email for details).
  - ii. **Take-Off: 7:00 am** (some events may vary).
  - iii. **Tournament Hours: 7:00 am - 2:00 pm** (some events may vary).
  - iv. **Official Weigh-In Start Time: 12:00 pm** (some events may vary).
  - v. **Boat Check-in Deadline: 2:00 pm** (late penalties apply, see below).
  - vi. **Weigh-In Hours: 12:00 pm - 3:00 pm** (some events may vary).
  - vii. **Scales Close:** Approximately **1 to 1 ½ hours** after the last flight check-in (some events may vary).
  - viii. **Award Ceremony:** Immediately following the conclusion of weigh-ins.
- b. **Juniors:**
  - i. Take-off occurs right after the last **High School** flight.
  - ii. **Juniors' weigh-in** is **1 hour prior** to the High School weigh-in.
- c. **Check-In & Launch Instructions:**
  - i. Upon arrival, **check-in** and then immediately **launch your boat**.
  - ii. **Stage your boat** in an area away from the ramp, following the instructions in the **Pre-Meeting Email**.
  - iii. All boats will **drive by the dock** or other designated spot with livewells **open for inspection** (unless inspected at check-in).
  - iv. Ensure you **check in** with the **volunteer** at the designated area to officially check in to avoid a late penalty.

- d. **Late Check-In Penalty:**
  - i. **Failure to check in** at the launch after an event will result in a penalty of **-25 Clash Points**.
  - ii. **Safety Concern:** If you do not check in and fail to return after the event, **9-1-1 may be called**, and your details will be provided for a possible search.
- e. **Leaving Early:**
  - i. If you leave **before the event ends**, you must **check in with the Tournament Director** to inform them you are leaving early.

## Section 8 - ICASSTT<sup>®</sup>, LLC Registration and Financials

### 1. **Registration Process:**

- a. Registration is done via the **Fishing Chaos Platform:** [Fishing Chaos Registration](#).
- b. All participants must purchase a **CASSTT membership:**
  - i. **Membership 1 (\$25):** Full membership, allowing anglers to compete in any event.
  - ii. **Membership 2 (\$15):** Allows anglers to compete in Mini's in their state; can be upgraded to Membership 1 by paying the difference anytime during the year.
- c. All Anglers must create their own **Fishing Chaos Profile** and join the **CASSTT Fishing Chaos Page**.
- d. After creating profiles, **CASSTT** will manually create a team for you.
- e. **Parents:** Do not create profiles for children using your email address.
- f. **Coaches paying for multiple boats:** Scroll to the bottom of the CASSTT page and select **BECOME A COACH**.
- g. Coaches will be contacted to make sure which boats are part of their team

### 2. **Fishing Chaos Fees and Memberships:**

- a. Fishing Chaos charges a fee to use their database. Membership options are available to offset these fees.

### 3. **School Issued Checks:**

- a. Checks from schools will be accepted and must be delivered **1 week before the event**.
- b. No checks will be accepted on the **morning of the event**.
- c. Contact [icassttdirector@gmail.com](mailto:icassttdirector@gmail.com) for payment arrangements using school-issued checks.

### 4. **Registration Deadlines and Refund Policy:**

- a. All registrations must be completed via Fishing Chaos before the event begins.
- b. No refunds or credits will be issued during the week of the event.
- c. To receive a credit, cancel at least **10 days prior to the event**.
- d. Refunds may be granted in cases where a waiting list exists and another boat takes your place (**minus square fees**).
- e. If the tournament is full, Fishing Chaos will notify you.

5. **Event Fees:**

- a. **High School Events:** \$60 per boat.
  - i. Scholarships will be awarded to the **Top 5 Teams** and the **Host School** (extends to Top 10 Teams if more than 200 boats compete).
- b. **Juniors Events:** \$40 per boat.
  - i. Scholarships will be awarded to the **Top 2 Teams** (extends to Top 5 Teams if more than 50 juniors compete).

6. **Scholarship Distribution:**

- a. Scholarships are provided at the end of each event in the form of a check.
