Section 1 - ICASSTT®, LLC Trail Qualifying Event Rules; Each State will have their own State's Trail (Senior Division)

7th Grade through 12th Grade

This will allow all anglers interested in scoring points for the ABT series can do so fully.

1. If your state sanctions High School Bass Fishing, all members of the team ***must*** attend the same high school to compete in ***ICASSTT®, LLC. (Illinois Teams)***
 - a. If your school doesn't have a team contact icassttdirector@gmail.com for an ***ICASSTT®, LLC*** denial letter.
 - b. 7th and 8th Graders must be from the district highschool of the team they fish for. (Illinois)

2. If your state does not sanction High School Bass Fishing, Regional Club teams are allowed to compete in **ICASSTT®, LLC**. (**Missouri & Wisconsin Teams**)
 - a. **ICASSTT®, LLC** prefers to use high school teams, so if there is a way to complete this **ICASSTT®, LLC** denial letter to waive your school from all liability, this way you can compete under your school name.
3. A team (defined as 2 anglers) fishing **ICASSTT®, LLC** will accumulate Clash Championship Points for their home state; those 2 individuals MUST fish together in their **ICASSTT®, LLC** State's Clash Championship.
 - a. Each team will be allowed to have 1 sub per fall season and 1 sub per spring season, teams must notify Humberto Gonzalez when you need a sub. (Exceptions can be made but need to be communicated well in advance)
 - i. With **ICASSTT®, LLC** approval, the coach may replace an angler with another from the team; The Reasons are as follows but not limited to; Previous Angler has been kicked off the team, Previous Angler has disciplinary problems (will need school letter stating so), Previous Angler has become ill. Other reasons will be listened to, but not all reasons will be accepted.
 - b. Solo Anglers
 - i. If a duo started off and they both wanted to split to become solo anglers, both anglers will carry their points with them, there will be no need to restart
 - ii. If an Angler was solo to start the season, and found a partner later on in the season, points will not be restarted. The new angler has to be a completely new angler that has not fished a tournament, if it is an angler that fish with another partner that would fall into the next rule 3c.
 - c. A team may switch partners permanently but will have to restart Clash Championship Points
4. Scholarship Award Breakdown Physical **ICASSTT®, LLC** checks will be given at the end of awards.
 - a. Host School
 - b. 1st Place
 - c. 2nd Place
 - d. 3rd Place
 - e. 4th Place
 - f. 5th Place
 - g. 6th Place - 10th Place if more than 200 boats registered.
 - h. Big Bass
5. All tournaments shall be a minimum 7 hours of length unless otherwise noted.
 - a. A completed tournament must be at least 4 hours in length
 - b. Any tournament lasting less than 4 hours will not be counted as a tournament
 - i. Incomplete tournaments will give no awards, scholarships, or Clash qualifying points
 - ii. **ICASSTT®, LLC** will try to reschedule any incomplete tournaments
 1. If a tournament is rescheduled and the new date conflicts with your schedule you have 24 hours to ask for a refund, failure to ask for this refund in the timeframe will result in no refund and your boat will hold a spot for that event.
 - iii. If an incomplete tournament cannot be rescheduled all participating teams will be issued a refund (Square Fees may or may not be refunded)
6. Coaches/Boaters on the Boat.
 - a. CANNOT Fish
 - b. Can verbally Coach

- c. Can physically Coach
 - i. With the exception of Casting in the Water.
 - 1. This includes "CASTING out a Backlash"
- d. Can tie knots
- e. Can handle rods
- f. Can manage tackle
- g. Can cull fish
- h. Can care for fish in livewell
 - i. Highly encouraged to do so, as well as coach your anglers on what you're doing
- i. Can help w/ the trolling motor
- j. Can net fish
 - i. Highly encourage anglers to do so
 - ii. You may hold an anglers rod while he/she takes the net
- k. Can remove hook from fish
- l. Basically you can do anything BUT FISH! Coaches, we want you to be involved.

Illinois: ICASSTT Only

- There will be 3 Divisions. Divisions are one way to qualify to the Clash Championship. These are the Divisions that all teams will compete in automatically.
 - ICASSTT Northern Division
 - Best 5 Events will be your Divisional Score
 - ICASSTT Central Division
 - Best 5 Events will be your Divisional Score
 - ICASSTT Southern Division
 - Best 5 Events will be your Divisional Score
- The Division you will be accumulating points will be based on where the Body of water is located geographically.
- ICASSTT Opens will be worth full points only if there are at least 20 boats in the field, but will not have automatic Clash Bids.
- There will be 10 more Boats that Qualify to the Clash via Wild Card, this will be determined by boats Best 10 Events

Missouri: MCASSTT Only

- At this time there will be no Divisions
- Teams will accumulate points at every event throughout the season
 - This is the first year of MCASSTT, so we'll need more data to determine the best system for MCASSTT in the future

Wisconsin: WCASSTT Only

- At this time there will be no Divisions
- Teams will accumulate points at every event throughout the season
 - This is the first year of WCASSTT, so we'll need more data to determine the best system for WCASSTT in the future

State's Clash Championship: How to Qualify

Illinois: ICASSTT Only 70 Boats Lake Springfield

- Ways to Qualify and be one of the Top 70 Boats for The Clash Championships (All standings will be kept on the website and updated by Monday Evening after the Event)
 - Winning Boat at an Event earns Automatic Qualification to The Clash Championship
 - 20 Teams(Boats) in the Northern, Central and Southern Divisions will earn a bid to fish The Clash via points or Champion Event Auto Bid.
 - 10 Boats will qualify out of the Wild Card Division; A team's best 10 events
 - **ICASSTT@, LLC** will keep track of your points, and can be found on www.icasstt.org
 - All points will be finalized by Monday Evenings
 - If a team(boat) earns a bid in multiple Divisions, The following will go in order
 - If a team earns multiple bids, the bid will be taken from the highest point value.(Northern, Central, Southern)
 - In the event of a tie for a team with two Divisions in their point value, the bid will be given to the highest standings between their tie
 - In the event of a tie between two other teams;
 - Tie Breaker will be broken by Total Series Points
 - Only Way that there can be more than 70 boats to go to the Clash is if any tie breakers can't be broken

- Illinois Teams can treat this series as an isolated Divisional Series, you DON'T have to commit to any one Division. You choose where to fish.

Missouri: MCASSTT ~100 Boats Lake TBD

- Ways to Qualify and be one of the Top ~100 Boats for The Clash Championships (All standings will be kept on the website and updated by Monday Evening after the Event)
 - Winning Boat at an Event earns Automatic Qualification to The Clash Championship
 - Top remaining Teams(Boats) to complete the 100 Boats will earn a bid to fish The Clash via points.
 - **ICASSTT®, LLC** will keep track of your points, and can be found on www.icasstt.org
 - All points will be finalized by Monday Evenings
 - Only Way that there can be more than ~100 boats to go to the Clash is if there is a tie.

Wisconsin: WCASSTT ~40 Boats Lake TBD

- Ways to Qualify and be one of the Top ~40 Boats for The Clash Championships (All standings will be kept on the website and updated by Monday Evening after the Event)
 - Winning Boat at an Event earns Automatic Qualification to The Clash Championship
 - Top remaining Teams(Boats) to complete the 40 Boats will earn a bid to fish The Clash via points.
 - **ICASSTT®, LLC** will keep track of your points, and can be found on www.icasstt.org
 - All points will be finalized by Monday Evenings
 - Only Way that there can be more than ~40 boats to go to the Clash is if there is a tie.

Section 2 - ICASSTT®, LLC Clash Championship; Each State will have their own Championship (High School Only)

1. Clash Championships will be a 2 day Tournament
2. **ICASSTT®, LLC** Clash Championship will have an entry fee to cover tournament expenses
 - a. Plaques for top 5 teams
 - b. Scholarships to top 10 teams
 - c. Clash Championship Plaque for Winning School/Club
 - d. Big Bass Award
 - e. Each Boat will receive an **ICASSTT®, LLC** goodie bag worth \$60-\$100
 - i. Bag will include a commemorative Clash Championship T-Shirt and variety of tackle.
3. The Takeoff order for the Clash Championship will be a random draw in 3 tiers; All-State Standings, Event Champions, then remaining boats
 - a. The Takeoff for day two of the Clash Championship will be reverse order.
4. **Scholarships Breakdown** to students at the Clash Championship.
 - a. 1st place team
 - b. 2nd place team

Section 3 - ICASSTT®, LLC Team of the Year Award T.O.Y. (High School Only)

1. Each school/club will score their highest placing up to 2 boats in each of the **ICASSTT®, LLC** tournaments Clash Championship.
 - a. Each State will have their own T.O.Y.
2. A team must weigh at least 1 bass to earn points
3. A plaque will be awarded for the T.O.Y.
4. The TOY will win \$500 for the school and a plaque
5. In case of a tie; tie breaker will be determined based on Clash Championship finish.

Illinois: ICASSTT Only

- Only the best 10 Events will count per School for T.O.Y. points.
- ICASSTT Opens will be worth ½ points from the scoring table below if the field doesn't have 20 boats.

Missouri: MCASSTT Only

- All Events will count per School/Club for T.O.Y. points

Wisconsin: WCASSTT Only

- All Events will count per School/Club for T.O.Y. points

 - i. **Illinois must score a minimum 2 Events per Division.**

- c. Illinois: Mini's will be worth ½ points from the scoring table below.

- a. 1st place finish = 10 All-State Points

Section 5 - The CASSTT Midwest Clash Championship - 100 Boats TBD Lake

The CASSTT Midwest Clash Championship will be a 3 day Event to crown your CASSTT Champion. This is the inaugural year for the Midwest Clash Championship so all details are still in the works. Below is what we hope to have for our qualifiers. Midwest Clash hopes to increase each year by having a new Midwest State start a new series.

****Bids will also be sent out to other Midwest States for an invitation until CASSTT has an established series in their state****

*****All bids below subject to change based on numbers throughout the year*****

Illinois: ICASSTT

- Top 30 Boats from All-State Rankings will earn a bid

Missouri: MCASSTT

- Top 50 Boats from All-State Rankings will earn a bid

Wisconsin: WCASSTT

- Top 20 Boats from All-State Rankings will earn a bid

Section 6 - ICASSTT®, LLC Fishing Rules

1. Most events will be 7:00 am - 2:00 pm (7 hours) unless otherwise noted (Some Events can and will start at Sunrise or 6am due to weather)
 - a. Juniors immediately after H.S. and 1 hour prior H.S. times.
2. All participants in the boat must wear life jackets when the outboard motor is running
 - a. Juniors must wear life jackets at ALL times.
3. Students should wear eye protection and hat protection
4. Boats must observe the lake horsepower and speed rules of the lake the tournament is being held on. (This is to be monitored only by Body of Water Authorities)

5. Boat captains must be of the age that would place them out of high school and be representatives of the school of some sort.
 - a. Each School/Club has their own requirements in who a boat captain can be. **ICASSTT®**, **LLC** is only responsible for having captains to be of age
6. Every angler in the boat must abide by the state and lake laws including but not limited to a current fishing license of age per state.
7. Only the boat captain can run the outboard motor with the exception of launching and loading
8. Each team (boat) may bring in up to 5 bass for weigh-in (**Will follow State's Youth Regulations**)
9. Each bass must be at least 12" in length (**Will follow State's Youth Regulations**)
 - a. Weighing in a fish shorter than 12 inches will lose that fish and the biggest fish.
 - b. Courtesy Bumps will always be allowed, but only if asked
 - c. In the event of EXTREME Heat or special weekend circumstances **ICASSTT®, LLC** may adopt a 3 fish limit maximum.
10. All fish must be kept in an aerated livewell during the tournament
11. Floggers ARE allowed
- 12. No penetrating cull tags are allowed.**
 - a. If caught using them you will be penalized 1lb per clip**
13. Penalty for Dead Fish: Conservation is our number one priority, students are still learning.
 - a. You cannot cull a dead fish
 - b. 8 ounce (1/2lb) for 1 dead fish
 - c. 12 ounce (3/4lb) for 2 dead fish
 - d. 1lb for 3 dead fish
14. Teams are allowed to weigh **only** 1 struggling fish early during **ANY** Event, scales must be open. What is a struggling fish? A fish that has been gut hooked, a fish that is not responding well in the livewell, a fish that is better suited to be in deeper water etc... This is a unique rule, and it has to do with Conservation of all bodies of waters that we visit. We are visitors, so we need to respect the places we compete at.
 - a. You Must Contact the Tournament Director.
 - i. If the Tournament Director is not available when you call, your team is responsible for making the decision to wait for the TD
 - b. The event time must have surpassed a minimum of 4 hours.
 - i. 6am Start, Can weigh that fish in starting at 10am
 - ii. 7am Start, Can weigh that fish in starting at 11am
 - iii. There are circumstances where this rule can be used earlier than the 4 hours. Discretion of Tournament Director.
 - c. If a team weighs a fish early. The Tournament Director will post the information so teams can be alerted of the situation.
 - d. This fish will be your Big Bass

There is no advantage to this rule, if a team decides they have to abandon their fishing place to make a run to the scales, they are losing valuable time and their position on the water. EVERY team can use this rule.

Weighing in a fish takes time away from the anglers.

15. There will be a 1 pound deduction per minute late penalty
16. After 5 minutes your team is DQed
17. Official Weigh Ins Begin 2 hours before the end of the Tournament

- a. If you need to weigh in earlier due to other circumstances please contact the Tournament Director
18. Both smallmouth and largemouth bass are allowed (No Striped Bass)
19. Artificial Baits Only: No live bait or trolling is allowed. Only one pole per person can be used at any given time. No A-Rigs allowed on any Body of Water.
20. All fish must be caught by legal means with a rod, reel, hook, and line
21. All fish must be caught from the boat during the official tournament time
22. Snagged or Foul Hooked fish caught on a spawning bed must be immediately released
23. All **ICASSTT@, LLC** events will use weigh bags to contain and carry the fish from the boat to the scale
24. After Weigh Ins it is expected to report to the back of the RV to take a photo
 - a. Our Sponsors are our biggest supporters. It is expected to give recognition to our sponsors.
25. All fish will be put back into the weigh bag and released directly to the lake after the fish have been weighed and photographed, unless we have a release boat, go straight to the release boat.
26. ~~Ties will be broken if the poundage is equal in the following manner:
 - a. ~~1st criteria will be the heaviest fish~~
 - b. ~~2nd criteria will be the number of fish~~
 - c. ~~The 3rd criteria will be a coin flip.~~
 - d. ~~Clash Championship will follow the same rules above (Big fish of either day breaks the tie)~~~~
27. ~~All Teams weigh Big Bass at every Event.~~
 - a. **Rule 26 & 27 above are currently on hold until Fishing Chaos updates their system for tie breakers**
28. All members of the team including the coach (boat captain) must obey any and all lake specific rules. Failure to follow the lake rules could result in disqualification based on the tournament director's decision and possible banishment of the series.
29. Violations: Any team wishing to make a formal complaint must do so in writing to the tournament director **within 10 minutes** of the end of the tournament.
 - a. 3 Random coaches will be selected at every event to conduct any rule infractions.
 - i. These 3 coaches must be reachable for the conclusion of the Event
 - b. If one of the 3 Random coaches is involved with an infraction, the tournament director will take their place.

****The Tournament Directors is subject to make all final decisions regarding disqualification****

30. Rules infractions
 - a. A team that has committed a rule violation will be disqualified from the event, the coach (not the students) may be banned from future tournaments and the entire school/club will be put on probation for the remainder of the season.
 - i. If a coach from the same school that is on warning has committed a rule violation the entire school/club will be banned from any **ICASSTT@, LLC** events for the remainder of the year. A school can petition to get back into the **ICASSTT@, LLC** series by stating their arguments.

1. If this Happens during the Clash You will lose your ability to Qualify for the Midwest Clash Championship and you will be banned for the following year.

Section 7 - ICASSTT® , LLC Schedule on day of Events

All events will follow this schedule unless otherwise noted via email

1. Check Ins: Approximately 2 hours before start of event and stage in take-off order(check pre-meeting email)
Take-Off: 7:00 am (Some events will vary)
Tournament: 7:00 am-2:00 pm (Some events will vary)
Official Weigh-In Start Time: 12pm (Some events will vary)
Boat Check-in 2:00 pm (see deductions for being late above)
Weigh-In: 12:00 pm-3:00 pm (Some events will vary)
Scales Close approximately 1 to 1 ½ hours after last flight check itn (Some events will vary)
Award Ceremony: Immediately After all boats weigh in
Juniors Take off right after the last H.S. Flight, Weigh-In 1 hour prior
2. Upon arriving at the event, check in and then immediately launch your boat and “stage” in an area away from the boat ramp
3. Boats should stage according to the Pre-Meeting Email Document sent out.
4. All boats will drive by the dock or other designated spot with all livewells open for inspection
 - a. Unless inspected at check in.
5. You must Check in with the Volunteer at the designated area to be officially checked in to avoid late penalty
6. **AT THE CONCLUSION OF AN EVENT, FAILURE TO CHECK IN AT THE LAUNCH WILL RESULT IN A PENALTY FOR YOUR BOAT -25 CLASH POINTS. This is a safety reason, future events, if you don't check in we may call 9-1-1 and let them know you are lost out on the water and we'll provide them with your information.**
 - a. **IF YOU LEAVE MUCH EARLIER BEFORE THE EVENT ENDS YOU MUST CHECK IN WITH YOUR TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR, TO INFORM THEM YOU ARE LEAVING EARLY.**

Section 8 - ICASSTT® , LLC Registration and Financials

1. Registration will be done using the event form found on the website
2. All participants must purchase a CASSTT membership.
 - a. Membership 1 \$25; Membership will have full membership to compete in any event
 - b. Membership 2 \$15; Membership will only allow anglers to fish Mini's in their state. Angler's can upgrade to membership 1 anytime of the year by paying the difference.
3. Emails that registered team will be emailed all of the Event's Details
 - a. There is no email distribution list for Events. Make sure those that register provide proper emails or forward all the information.
 - b. Take off order will be randomized via online Random.org we'll use Dice Roller to determine how many times to randomize the list.

4. Payment link will be at the conclusion of form registration, payments will be done by Square.
5. School Issued Checks will be accepted
 - a. This needs to be completed well in advance so we can complete the portion manually on Fishing Chaos.
6. ABSOLUTELY NO STUDENTS SHOULD BE REGISTERING TEAMS
 - a. Due to the financial responsibility and legal waiver you are signing.
 - b. All Participants will have to sign a liability waiver to have on record for the year.
 - c. If a student is found registering for a team that team can:
 - i. Be denied any Scholarship Earnings
 - ii. Be denied any All-State Points
 - iii. Be denied T.O.Y. Points
 - iv. Be denied any future **ICASSTT®, LLC** Events
 - v. Be denied to fish said Event
 - vi. Will be denied a refund
7. High School Events \$60
 - a. Scholarships will be provided at the end of each Event in the form of a check.
 - b. Top 5 Teams and Host School (subject to be top 10 teams if more than 200 boats compete)
8. Juniors \$40
 - a. Scholarships will be provided at the end of each Event in the form of a check.
 - b. Top 2 Teams (subject to be top 5 teams if more than 50 juniors compete)
9. **NO STUDENT WILL EVER RECEIVE DIRECT FUNDS FROM ICASSTT®, LLC All Scholarships will be written out to an Adult.**
10. **ICASSTT®, LLC** will accept SCHOOL ISSUED Checks as payments. If you wish to pay with a school issued check
 - a. Check must be delivered 1 week before the event
 - i. No Checks will be accepted the morning of the Event
 - b. Contact icassttdirector@gmail.com if you will be paying with a school issued check
11. All registrations must be completed via form prior to the start of the event
12. The week of the Event, there will be no Refunds or Credits to teams registered for the event. If you wish to pull out of the event and receive a credit please do so 10 Days prior to the Event.

Subject to refund in some cases
13. Refunds will be given If there is a waiting list and a boat takes your place. You will receive a full refund.(square fees excluded)
14. If a tournament is full, Square Payments will prompt you that the Event Item is out of Stock, your time stamped registrations determines your line on the waitlist
 - a. If your team is the next boat in line you will be sent an invoice to pay to enter the event.
